## STEEL TARGET RULES

- 1. The use of steel targets is restricted to members (and their guests) who have been qualified and approved by the designated Steel Safety Officer.
- 2. All steel targets must be constructed of AR-500 steel or approved substitute.
- 3. Standard handgun calibers only, including .22 rimfire, will be allowed. Centerfire rifles, rifle calibers in handguns, .17 caliber rimfire/centerfire and .22 magnum are not allowed.
- 4. Steel targets must be placed so that any miss will impact the berms. No rounds shall hit the ground in front of the berms.
- 5. All steel targets must be flat and free of dents, gouges or imperfections that may throw bullets or jacket material back to the shooter.
- 6. Target stands must be constructed of material that will prevent objects from being thrown back to the shooter. Stands of lightweight material should not be used.
- 7. Target stands should hold the target firmly. Targets must remain perpendicular to the shooter and not be twisted left/right or at odd angles.
- 8. Steel targets must be no closer than 12 yards from the shooter and be installed such that the steel is slanted slightly downrange at the bottom.
- 9. Steel thickness must be a minimum of 3/8" thick.
- 10. Use of steel shot, steel core, penetrator or armor piercing rounds is prohibited.
- 11. A member of the B.O.D. is to be notified immediately of any problems that arise from use of steel targets.
- 12. Steel targets will only be used on the 25yd multipurpose range.
- 13. Eye protection is required.

## SAFETY ACHNOWLEDGEMENT

I acknowledge the safety rules above and agree to abide by those rules and all other rules of Palo Alto Rifle & Pistol Club. I further understand that shooting steel targets is a privilege which requires extreme care and diligence.

I also understand that any violation or unsafe conduct may result in expulsion from Palo Alto Rifle & Pistol Club.
